Fast


| Build Twitter or email = slow

The Department of Energy (DOE) is studying whether to sell frracked liquefied natural gas (LNG) overseas. But DOE is not looking at the effects fracking natural gas has on clean water, clean air, and public health. DOE is only studying the economics of exporting fracked LNG.

Reasons for WORC to use FB Ad strategy



These voters are heavy FB users - best tool to reach audience



Able to target specific zip codes - no spillover



Cheaper and faster than radio

422 "likes" in under 2 weeks



Cost = \$.01 - \$.04 per click



Then educate, frame and mobilize



Question: Did the strategy influence the election?



Always hard to tell, anecdotal



But WORC believes it had a significant effect

Increased Native American turnout

Candidates won

Spent less money than last election

Now have long term connections with these voters for next election cycle
